

#### General objectives and questions

#### General objective of the workshop:

 The workshop will seek to identify innovative solutions to some of the main challenges related to the inclusion of migrants in national and international statistical and administrative data on health.

- 1. How do we ensure inclusion of migrants into national health surveys?
- 2. How do we ensure information on migrants in *registry data* on diseases and on health service utilization?
- 3. How do we obtain *continuity of health data* on migrants across countries and over time?
