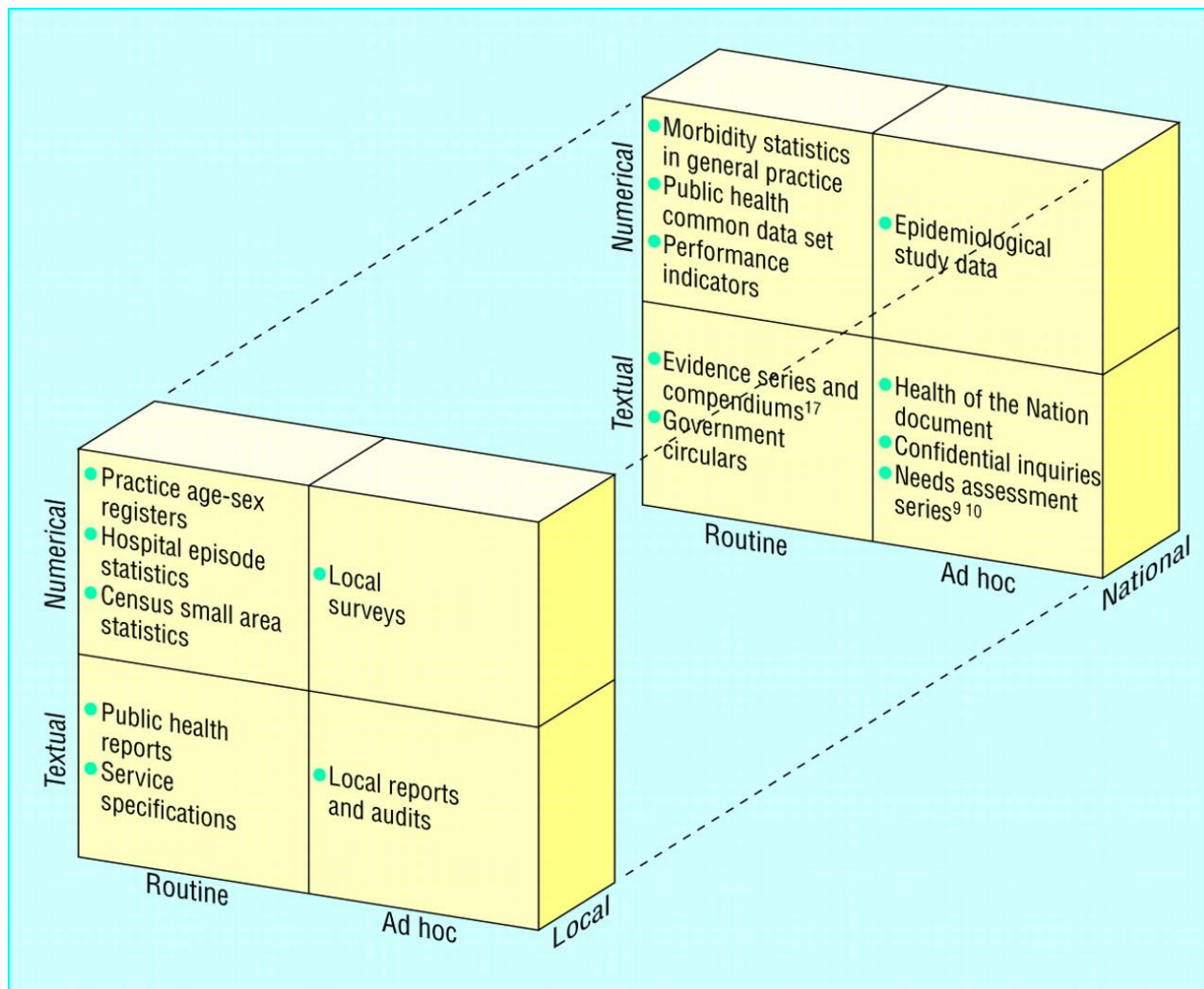

## *General objective of the workshop:*
