The aim for and possible realization of Migrant Health Data Task-Force in rural regions

- Setablishing a framework for collaborative action; advocating for the right to health of refugees, asylum seekers and migrants;
- addressing the social determinants of health;
- achieving public health preparedness and ensuring an effective response;
- strengthening health systems and their resilience; preventing communicable diseases;
- preventing and reducing the risks posed by noncommunicable diseases;
- ensuring ethical and effective health screening and assessment; and
- improving health information and communication.

Scope and purpose of the Consensus Conference WHO – University of Pécs Medical School 7-8 October 2019

The main goal of this event was to bring together leading experts in migrant health with the aim of working out the basic principles of a highly coherent and **consistent European Migrant Health** Database, as an essential tool for the 'evidence based' planning and development of public health and health care systems that are prepared and capable to address the new challenges.



According to UN DESA, in the year of 2019, about 272 million people were estimated to be international migrants. Out of them UNHCR recorded 20.4 million as refugees and 3.5 million as asylum seekers.

According to ILO nearly 60% of them, an estimated 164 million are migrant workers and a significant share of them are living in rural regions.



Conference statement on improving health information systems for migration health (1)

Participants with consensus recommended:

- Measures to facilitate harmonisation of definitions, variables, indicators and categories to ensure cross-border comparability of data and addressing the gaps in data collection in order to ensure compatibility and completeness of data;
- Improving international cooperation and governance of data management in order to share and transfer data if there is a justifiable need to share data;
- Encouraging inclusion of migration-related variables in routine data collection; encouraging data linkage where this is possible and practically feasible;

This could be achieved through the following means:

- Provision of technical guidance on taxonomy and methodologies of data collection and interpretation that the proceedings of this conference will inform. This should be a scientific publication;
- Establishment of a multi-stakeholder scientific task force to be concerned with the topic and challenges related to data collection, mapping of existing health information systems and methodologies, contributing to the development of the technical guidance and translation of evidence into policy;
- Training and capacity building on approaches to mainstreaming migration into health information systems;



Establishment of the multi-stakeholder scientific task force

On 11.02.2020 an online meeting was organized where participants have adopted the Terms of Reference of the TF and with consensus

Prof. Kayvan Bosorghmeher was eleceted for its president;

The WHO CC at University of Pécs Medical School is hosting its secretariat;

Beside individual experts WHO, IOM, ECDC and the European Union Agency for Fundamental Rights has appointed delegates;



The Consensus Conference Follow up Task-Force is an

- informal,
- voluntary,
- scientific body,

aiming to assist and facilitate the realization of the Statement of the Conference.

Scope of the Task-Force (1)

- Calling the attention about the need
 - for reliable, migrants/migration related health, public health and occupational health data;
 - for the harmonisation of the migrants/migration related health information systems;
 - for the establishment of international cooperation;
- Design and work out unified definitions and technical guidance on taxonomy and methodologies of data collection;



- Facilitate and assist both: individual researchers' and teams' endowers for the international harmonisation of target group variables and indicators in order to ensure comparability of data;
- Call the attention for and initiate of the establishment of European level migrant health database, and provide scientific and technical assistance for its realization.
